Background

Hand, foot, and mouth disease (HFMD) is a contagious illness primarily affecting children under 10, characterized by vesicles or rashes on the palms, soles, and oral mucosa, leading to discomfort and difficulty swallowing.

In Indonesia, HFMD cases have been rising from 2021 to 2024, yet health authorities' prevention efforts have been deemed ineffective due to low frequency and poor visual hierarchy in media communications. Currently, there is no specific campaign in Indonesia focused on HFMD prevention



Background

Research shows that parents have a basic understanding of HFMD, indicating a need for more persuasive education on preventive measures, effectively structured using the AIDA (Attention, Interest, Desire, Action), PESO (Paid, Earned, Shared, Owned media), and HOE (Hierarchy of Effects) models.

This health campaign aims to encourage parents to educate themselves and others about preventing HFMD among children.

The trend of HFMD cases has been increasing in Indonesia from 2021 to 2024. Health authorities have disseminated information on HFMD prevention. However, the effectiveness of these efforts has been assessed as low due to suboptimal frequency and visual hierarchy in the media. To date, there has been no campaign in Indonesia specifically focused on preventing HFMD. This research aims to persuade parents to understand preventive measures to curb the spread of HFMD among children. Interview results indicate that parents' understanding of HFMD remains basic and general, highlighting the need for persuasive education to provide a comprehensive understanding of HFMD and its preventive steps. This health campaign is designed to encourage parents to educate themselves and others about preventing the spread of HFMD among children in the future.
